**Proposal To Adopt An Act 345 Retirement System
For Police Officers And Firefighters**

Shall the City of Roseville, Macomb County, Michigan, be authorized to establish a separate retirement system pursuant to 1937 PA 345, as amended, for the benefit of police officers and firefighters employed by the City or retired from the City, create a board of trustees to manage and operate the system, all contingent upon the approval by the electors of a City Charter amendment authorizing the transfer of police officer and firefighter members from the current employee's retirement system to the new system created under Act 345?

**CITY OF ROSEVILLE

RESOLUTION PROPOSING A CHARTER AMENDMENT
AND BALLOT PROPOSAL TO ESTABLISH A POLICE AND
FIRE RETIREMENT SYSTEM PURSUANT TO ACT 345 OF 1937, AS AMENDED.**

At a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Roseville, held in the Council Chambers, 29777 Gratiot Avenue, Roseville, Michigan on the 9th day of July, 2019, commencing at 6:30 p.m.

PRESENT: Mayor Robert Taylor, Mayor Pro Tem Jan Haggerty, Councilpersons Colleen McCartney, Catherine Haugh, Bill Shoemaker, Charles Frontera and Steve Wietecha.

ABSENT: None

WHEREAS, the purpose of this amendment is to update the current language pertaining to the employees' retirement system to provide for a system for general employees and a separate system for firefighters and police officers. The resulting change would allow efficiencies to be incurred and changes to the systems via ordinance amendments adopted by City Council. The Charter Amendment would provide for two separate boards, further aligning with the interest of the respective members of each of the systems in accordance with the current Charter language and Public Act 345 of 1937, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion by Councilwoman Catherine Haugh, supported by Mayor Pro Tem Jan Haggerty it is hereby resolved as follows:

1. By a 3/5 vote of its members elect, pursuant to the authority granted by Public Act 279 of 1909, as amended, proposes that Chapter 15.1 and 15.3 of the City of Roseville Charter shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 15.1 Employees' retirement system established.
The City of Roseville Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as the retirement system, is hereby established for the purpose of providing retirement allowances and death benefits for the officers and employees of the city of Roseville, state of Michigan, under the provisions of this chapter. Beginning with the 2020-2021 fiscal year, police officers and firefighters shall instead become members of a separate retirement system established pursuant to Act 345 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1937, as amended, and contributions to the current retirement

system made by or on behalf of such police officers, firefighters and retired police officers and firefighters shall be transferred to the Act 345 system. Financial benefits heretofore accrued in this retirement system by such police officers and firefighters shall not be diminished or impaired by such transfer to the Act 345 retirement system. All benefits and terms of employment as set forth in Collective Bargaining Agreements in effect shall not be diminished or impaired by adoption of the Act 345 retirement system.

Sec. 15.3 Board of trustees; creation, composition.

Effective with 2020-2021 fiscal year, a Board established under PA Act 345 of 1937, as amended, shall manage and operate the retirement system for all police officers, firefighters and retired police officers and firefighters. There is hereby created a board of trustees in whom is vested the general administration, management, and responsibility for the proper operation of the retirement system and for making effective the provisions of this retirement system. The board shall consist of five trustees, as follows:

- (1) The mayor of the city.
- (2) A councilman to be selected by the members of the council.
- (3) A citizen who is a taxpayer of the city, and who is neither a member or a beneficiary of the retirement system, to be appointed by the mayor, subject to confirmation by the council.
- (4) Two (2) members of the retirement system are to be elected by the members of the retirement system.
- (5) The election of the trustees provided for in paragraph (4) of this section shall be conducted according to such rules and regulations as the board shall adopt to govern such elections.

2. The proposed amendments to Chapter 15 of the City of Roseville Charter shall be submitted to the qualified electors of this City at the General Election to be held in the City of Roseville on November 5, 2019, and the approval of the amendment, as well as the approval of the establishment of said retirement system for police officers

and firefighters pursuant to Act 345 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1937, as amended, shall become effective upon approval of the electorate and upon the filing of said amendments thereafter in the manner required by law.

3. The proposed amendment shall be submitted to the Electors in the following format:

**Proposed Amendment To Sections 15.1 And 15.3
Of Chapter 15 Of The Roseville City Charter**

Shall Chapter 15 of the Charter of the City of Roseville be amended so that police officers and firefighters are excluded from the retirement system established by the City Charter, effective with the 2020-2021 fiscal year, and instead become members of a separate retirement system under 1937 PA 345, as amended, and that accumulated contributions to the current employee's retirement system made by or on behalf of such officers be transferred to the Act 345 retirement system? *This charter amendment shall not be effective, unless the electors approve the establishment of a separate retirement system under said Act 345.*

5. The City Clerk shall transmit a copy of the proposed amendment to the Governor of the State of Michigan for approval.

6. The City Clerk shall, prior to the printing of said Official Ballot, submit the proposed form of the ballot to the Attorney General of the State of Michigan for his approval as to compliance with Michigan law.

7. The City Clerk shall cause notice of said proposed charter amendment and of said election to be given as required by the city charter and the statutes of the State of Michigan.

8. The proposed charter amendment shall be published in full together with the existing charter provision altered or abrogated by the amendment once in the City's designated newspaper not less than 14 days prior to the election, and shall be posted as required by law.

9. The canvass and determination of the votes of said question shall be made in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan and the Charter of the City of Roseville.

10. Any and all resolutions in conflict herewith are repealed only to the extent necessary to give full force and effect to the foregoing provisions.

11. This Resolution is deemed severable and should any provision, clause, word or sentence be deemed unenforceable, the remainder shall remain in full force and effect.
